

Dear Friends,

Have you ever had the experience of having wronged someone, knew you were in the wrong, went to the person and asked for forgiveness, and they forgave you? I sure have. There's nothing quite like knowing you've been truly forgiven.

Have you ever had the experience of being the one who was harmed and forgiving the one who harmed you? Remember how freeing it was to let go of your anger and resentment?

Have there been times when you did NOT receive the forgiveness you asked for? Have there been times when, hard as you tried, you simply could not forgive someone else?

In the Gospel of Matthew, Peter asks Jesus, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?" And Jesus answers, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times." (Matthew 18:21-22)

In a time when churches are experiencing deep anxiety like never before, and the people of our nation—and in our own communities—continue to be bitterly divided about so many things, the topic of forgiveness has never been more important. Therefore, our next sermon series is all about FORGIVENESS: what it is, what it is not, why it matters so much, how to forgive others, how to ask for forgiveness, and even how to forgive ourselves (sometimes this is the hardest thing of all).

So, bring an open mind and open heart to worship beginning July 11, as we journey through an in-depth look at the important topic of forgiveness. In preparation for this series, you may want to do some reflection on how forgiveness—or the lack of it—has shaped you and your own life.

On a completely different note: the beginning of July marks the beginning of my eighth year with this congregation! I started here on June 29, 2014 as your designated associate pastor, became your designated pastor in May of 2017, and was installed as pastor in September 2019. It continues to be an adventure and an honor to minister to and with you all. And, as I reflect on this past year especially, I also offer a heartfelt thank you to you for your ministry to me as I journeyed through cancer and the shock and grief of losing my husband last fall. Thanks be to God for each and every one of you.

Session Highlights for June

Session met on June 21, 2021. Melanie Hancock, General Presbyter, and Phyl Stutzman, member of Committee on Ministry, were present to conduct a review of Patrick Yancey in his ministry with First Presbyterian. A fruitful discussion involved both Pat and the Session in evaluating our ministry in general and our interaction with each other.

- Melanie McQuere was reelected as Clerk of the Session, and Roger Basinger as Treasurer for the 2021-2022 year.
- The Session approved an increase of ten hours per week for Carrie Riordan, Director of Communications, as the church opens up more and increases programming.
- An expenditure from undesignated memorial funds was approved to cover the cost of exterior painting of the church.
- Expenditure from the Burns Memorial Fund for sound system maintenance was approved to replace the soundboard in the sanctuary to update and increase controls.
- Adjustments to worship procedures were approved as health officials continue to relax restrictions. These may be modified at any time subject to CDC or local guidelines.
 - * The ropes used to block off alternate rows in the sanctuary have been removed.
 - * Coffee and lemonade service (no food) after worship resumed on Sunday, June 26, 2021.
 - * Those members of the congregation and soloists who have been vaccinated should be allowed to sing without masks immediately.
 - * Communion kits should continue to be used though the summer, on the first Sundays of July and August, or until such time as current stocks are used up.

Effective September 12, 2021:

- The 8:30 service will resume Sunday, September 12. Sandra will consult with various involved families to determine if they feel safe worshiping in the chapel, or if the service should be in the sanctuary for distancing.
- The offering will return to pre-pandemic style (passing the plates through the rows) on Sunday, September 12. Jim Rose will continue as usher captain for the immediate future, until such time as a successor is named.
- Children may come forward during Children's Time. (Children's Time should continue in its present form through the summer.)
- The choir will resume singing on Sunday, September 12, with rehearsals before that as deemed necessary by Kevin Kellim, Director of Music. Those choir members who have been vaccinated may sing without masks. Unvaccinated choir members are requested to continue using masks while singing.
- Serving Communion to worshipers in pews will resume with World Wide Communion Sunday on October 3, 2021.

Noah's Ark Reopening July 11

The Noah's Ark Sensory Room, for children and youth who experience a meltdown, are over stimulated, or simply need a break, will be reopening on July 11. Located in the Children's Library, it features low lighting, soft music, calming bottles, sensory boxes, learning bags, stress balls, puzzles, board games, and a reading corner. Parents, grandparents, or guardians should accompany children to the sensory room. When possible, the room is staffed with a volunteer who has certification through Safe Gatherings. If a volunteer is present, the child can remain unaccompanied. Noah's Ark is not a nursery and is not suitable for infants.

As we begin the return to our regular worship tradition, the singers will serve as soloists in July, and guest musicians will provide music in August. The Chancel Choir will resume rehearsals on September 2, and return to worship on September 12, 2021.

Member Spotlight: Jeff Gustin

When you meet Jeff Gustin and talk to him for even just a little while, it's immediately apparent that he's a nice guy who enjoys life and has with a love of bad jokes (ask about the moth at your own peril). In college he played football and after college played semi-pro football for the Omaha Mustangs. He's an avid sports fan and cheers on the K-State Wildcats whenever he has a chance.

Jeff spent 38 years serving the USD 337 Royal Valley School District. His first 35 years were spent teaching, coaching, and holding administrative positions. He retired in July 2017 as USD 337 athletic director, transportation director, and assistant middle school principal. He then went right back into the classroom for three more years with Jobs for America's Graduates (JAG), growing what had been a program of a dozen kids to more than 40 actively engaged students, before retiring for good in August 2020. "My entire career was very rewarding but I have to say the JAG program will always be close to my heart. Seeing kids realize what they can achieve and seeing them excited about their futures was very uplifting," said Jeff.

Chris Gustin, Jeff's wife, served Royal Valley for 39 years as a beloved business teacher before retiring in June 2020. Chris and Jeff have two adult daughters, Aubree (husband Thad) and Ashlee (who is getting married August 28, 2021). They also enjoy the antics of their two Golden Retrievers, "who are not at all spoiled," according to Jeff.

The Gustins have been members of FPC for 31 years. They began attending because Chris' parents were members. Jeff is an active member of the fellowship team, and the captain of usher team 1—a post he is happy to be back at now that we are worshiping regularly in the sanctuary again. He is also a member of the FPC Deacon Class of 2023 and will assume the role of moderator in August, 2021.

"As Deacons, we're charged with 'doing the work of the church' and providing congregational care," Jeff said. He wants to see the deacons continue to expand member outreach and "help members get what they need, whatever that may be." Jeff is also likes technology and would like to see FPC continue to use it to connect church members with each other, and connect with those outside of our congregation, especially young families.

Jeff and Chris live on three acres in North Topeka. Jeff is passionate about gardening and grows a variety of vegetables and flowers. "Gardening is really relaxing to me, even when I'm doing the hard work parts. Our backyard is my oasis and one of my favorite places to spend time."

A Message from Your Stephen Ministers

What is a “process approach” used by Stephen Ministers? A focus on effective caring is to focus on the process for experiencing emotional, relational, and spiritual healing. This is the relationship a Stephen Minister brings to a caring relationship.

There are five key elements of a process approach to caring for another to experience emotional, relational, and spiritual healing and growth:

- **Presence:** Consistently being with the care receiver. Stephen Ministers have a saying “be here now” meaning be present with only the care receiver in our minds, no distractions.
- **Service:** Helping the care receiver without expecting anything in return. A caring relationship is a 1-way focus that is fully on the care receiver.
- **Skills:** Using best caregiving practices by being focused and attentive during visits, reflecting and validating the care receiver’s feelings, listening with our hearts, and allowing the care receiver to discuss the situation at their own pace, while trusting God to work through the process to bring hope and healing.
- **Boundaries:** Respecting and empowering the care receiver’s personhood, recognizing that the care receiver can and should think and make decisions for themselves.
- **Trust:** Is built through all of the prior key elements along with knowing the relationship is private and a safe relationship in which to discuss anything, including discussion about God and faith. Ministers are care givers and trust that God is the “cure giver” providing healing, faith, forgiveness, hope, and peace.

A Letter of Thanks from a Neighbor

We wanted to share with you a letter Sandra received in late May from a Topeka woman who shared in our ministries during the pandemic. She found us through our WIBW Sunday worship broadcasts. Included with her letter was a small donation to help us continue our ministries to share the love of Jesus Christ with our neighbors.

Dear Pastor Brown,

This is a "thank you" for being a Sunday staple for this elderly, ill, shut-in Baptist couple. My husband, Doug, of 43 years, had advanced Alzheimer's and Parkinson's. I'm young at heart, but pretty old everywhere else.

Our nightmare of a year saw one of our 5 sons have a leg amputated, nearly dying of a raging infection and having a second amputation. Husband Doug became bed-ridden. The day after Christmas I came down with Covid from somewhere. I stayed home taking care of Doug as he was already exposed. He had a bad fall trying to get out of bed, had to go by the ambulance to the hospital. I wasn't allowed to go. He tested positive for Covid as well as injuries from the fall. He died alone in a Covid ward. I was broken-hearted.

Through it all, God sent us blessings. Some days I had to look closely to find them. You were one I found on T.V. Our church was on-line but I couldn't access it. I related to you with losing your husband, and have prayed for you. The music is beautiful. Your ministry, powerful and up-lifting. Your "challenges" have given me a new direction. I've accepted them to set my own goals for numbers of prayers, outreach to others, donations of food, clothing and money. This week I am singing a "new song" from my at-home hymnal, and I even wrote my own "new song" to sing.

I'm back at First Baptist now. I "boo hoo" a lot and volunteer when I am able. I will never forget you.
